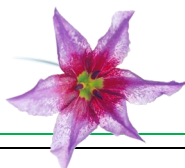

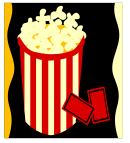

Use it or Lose It

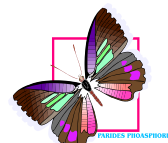

"Remembering What You See"

Find a picture in a magazine or newspaper that is filled with action. Now, consciously pay attention to everything that is portrayed, paying special attention to details. Take 3-4 minutes to observe the picture carefully. Now, cover the picture and ask yourself these questions:

- How many people are in the picture?
- How many animals or birds are in the picture?
- Are there buildings, cars or other vehicles?
- What are the people wearing?
- What are the people and animals doing?
- What is the picture trying to say to you?

Usually we are surprised by the details we have missed or forgotten. Try a second picture as a way of encouraging yourself to be more observant.
