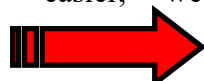


Hacienda Give Back Night

Use it or Lose It

New research on the human brain shows that the brain responds well to the right kind of stimuli (both mental and physical activity). I encourage you to incorporate them into your daily life and let's keep ourselves as active & healthy as we can! This month:

"Trees"

How many trees do you think you can list? Take a guess at the number you think you can remember. Now,, write them down on a piece of paper. You probably can recall more than you thought. When you think you have exhausted all your ideas, now is the time to press yourself to remember more.



Think of trees that you associate with different events or phases of your life—childhood, teenage years, adulthood, present day. Think in terms of where you played, vacations, special events and places where you lived.

A timeline can be developed on an 8 1/2 by lengthwise and writing the years above that line. The names of the trees you recall can then be written below the line.
