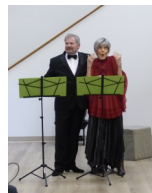

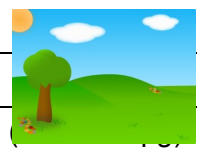

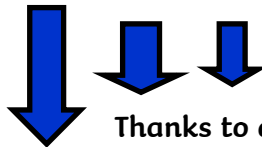

## Reins of Life

### Therapeutic Horseback Riding

### NEEDS Volunteers! Especially horse feeders

Reins of Life is a therapeutic horseback riding facility for children and adults with disabilities. They are located at 9375 W 300 N in Michigan City. They have 13 equines on the property, including a miniature Mediterranean donkey.



Since they are a not-for-profit organization, volunteers are a necessary and precious commodity. **THEY ESPECIALLY NEED PEOPLE TO VOLUNTEER DURING THE DAY** when so many are at work or school. Volunteer opportunities include:

- ◆ Feeding—Horses need to be fed twice per day.
- ◆ Sidewalker—Assures that the rider is safe, supports and helps the rider stay focused, and assists with reining, etc.
- ◆ Leader—The horse leader concentrates on the horse, following the directions of the instructor and leading the horse if the rider is not able to “steer” the horse properly.
