You'll laugh, you'll sing along, and you'll be dazzled by their theatrics. No need to sign up. It's here at the Senior Center and it's a FREE show!

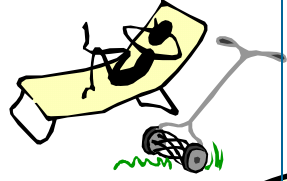


Indiana Dunes Historical Presentation

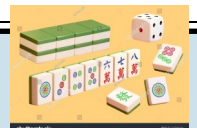

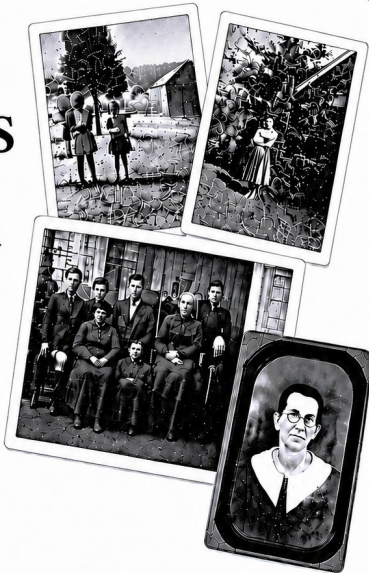

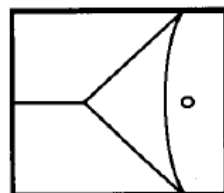
